#### What to do with ashes

Following the funeral, if it has been a cremation service, families face the delicate but important decision of what to do with the ashes.

There are a range of meaningful options for paying tribute to a child.

In the UK, ashes can be scattered almost anywhere. However, on private land it is important to get the landowner's permission first.

Where to scatter the ashes is a personal choice. A key consideration is whether you want to scatter nearby, for example, in a local park or even your garden, or perhaps somewhere a bit further afield at a place your child loved, such as the seaside or a national park. Sports grounds are also popular locations for ashes scattering but each venue will have its own policy, so it's essential to check first.

Alternatively, ashes don't have to be scattered at all. They can be kept at home in a beautiful urn or buried in the crematorium grounds or a local cemetery in their own plot or as part of a family grave.

A lovely way for a person's memory to live on is by planting a tree on top of the ashes. Watching it grow year after year can bring great comfort.

There are lots of things you can do with ashes to honour your child's memory. But if you're unsure, a member of our team will gladly advise on everything from local and national regulations to burial and scattering processes.
